Crime Watch Report

Hi, neighbors,

Spring is here and we all want to spruce up the yard and flowerbeds and paint the outside. But we also need to be watchful of our surroundings.

Recently I was driving through the neighborhood and many of you were out working in your yards. As I saw you in the front yards I would then drive up through the alley and wouldn't you know, most of you had your GARAGE DOORS OPEN!

I know it's a hassle but you MUST keep those doors down while working in your yards unless you can see them every minute. The burglars are also watching you and it only takes them a few seconds to get what they want.

They could, and have, gone right into your home and taken your TV, laptop, cell phone, cash and credit cards and be gone before you even know they were there.

Crime right now is down in our area but it is up in the northern part of the city. This could change if you keep leaving the door of opportunity open. So, when you're outside, stop and think, did I put the garage door down? Check it.

Thanks to all of you who have been leaving your outside lights on at night. It really helps us on late night patrols. Some alleys are very dark and there are too many shadows for the crooks to hide in, so let's keep those lights on. I know it costs a few extra dollars but it is worth it.

On another note, there is a new way for thieves to get into your locked car while you are out shopping.

How to Lock Your Car

You park your car, get out, and as you walk away, you push the remote, hear the horn, see the lights flash and leave only to come back after shopping to find your car UNLOCKED and your laptop, GPS, and whatever, gone.

There is a device that robbers are using to clone your security code when you lock your car using your remote. They sit in parking lots and watch as you pull in. They know you will be gone for awhile. As you push the button on your remote it sends a signal that they can capture and enter your car after you are in the store. When you push the LOCK button on your door, it does NOT send a signal and your car is still protected.

This is something totally new and is real. Please be aware of this and tell a friend. Remember, while out shopping or out to dinner, use the LOCK button on your door and NOT your remote.

Also, be aware of people around you when you return to your car as they are also watching you return. If things don't look right, go back into the store and call for security to escort you to your car. They are happy to do so.

Summer PD camps teach safety to kids

Registration is underway for Summer Safety Camp presented by the Richardson Police Department.

Children who have completed kindergarten and not yet entered 4th grade are eligible.

There are nine week-long sessions during the summer from 9 a.m. to noon each day at the Richardson Police Sub-Station, 2003 E. Renner Road.

Cost is \$10 per child which includes all materials and snacks. The fee is to be paid the first day of camp. Children may attend only one session.

Applications can also be picked up at the Richardson Police Station, 140 N. Greenville Ave.

Applications will be processed on a first-come, first-served basis with children who have not attended in the past processed first.

Quick Tip

Keep track of your valuables. It's important to take a complete inventory of your belongings.

Note the model and serial numbers of your appliances, television sets, laptops, audio equipment, computers, printers, guns, etc.

Take photographs of your jewelry and other valuables and keep several copies of your list in safe places being sure to update the list with each new purchase.

Engrave the letters "TX" (for Texas) and your driver's license number on all valuables and get your vehicle's identification number (VIN) etched on the window glass (a free service offered by the

police.

These are very effective tools Used by law enforcement to help fight crime.

City of Richardson ordinances say control dog barking and "scoop the poop"

It's rude.
It's un-neighborly.
It's against the law.

The Richardson City Code includes ordinances instructing residents to pick up after their dogs and to control dogs that bark excessively.

Richland Park offers "pooper scooper" bag dispensers for your convenience. If you're walking your dog in the neighborhood, the city notes that doubled newspaper delivery bags or empty bread bags can also be used as pooper scooper mitts. The point is, you are to clean up after your animals. Period.

If you know who the pet owner is who does not clean up after her/his pet, call the Richardson Animal Shelter 972-744-4480, for further action.

According to an article in "Richardson Today," if you are disturbed by excessive barking in the neighborhood, you can also call the Richardson Animal Shelter. An animal service officer will visit the home of the offending dog and talk to the owner about methods of quieting the dog. If the barking continues, you may call again and a formal letter will be sent to the dog owner.

If the problem continues, you may file an affidavit against the dog owner and will need to appear in court to testify.
