

To all of you, I wish a Merry Christmas, and hope that you will be able to spend time with family and loved ones.





#### A few Tips for Building a Two-Story Addition

Homeowners who might have tried to sell their houses a few years ago are staying put with the hope that they'll fetch a higher price if they wait out the bad economy. In the meantime, some are making their homes more comfortable by adding rooms—downstairs and up.

Duplicate architectural elements from the main house in both the interior and exterior of the addition—on both floors—to create a sense of unity between old and new.

Mismatched windows are a telltale sign that part of the house has been added on. Choose windows in the same style and material—or at least a lookalike material—as the ones on the original structure. Keep the sill lines even on both structures.

Blend the new flooring with the old. the rich-but-worn look of old hardwood floors is hard to replicate with brand-new material.

You can also make an addition "match" the rest of the house by remodeling parts of the existing structure so it includes some of the addition's modern touches.

Incorporate modern materials that look authentic and match the main house but that are engineered to last longer, hold up better to harsh weather, and require less maintenance.

Convince your clients to upgrade the HVAC. An air-conditioning unit that's properly sized for the original structure will not perform well if you add more than about 30 square feet to the house. Most clients resist replacing their existing units because of the cost, but that their homes are usually uncomfortably humid later if they don't—especially if the two-story addition includes an unconditioned garage under new living quarters.

Consider the "flow" of the house. "This is a very big deal,". "We put a lot of effort into making sure [the layout of the house] still makes sense" once it has an addition, "so you don't have to go to the middle of the living room to get to the new kitchen." Sometimes, that means reallocating the space in rooms besides the ones you're adding on.

Remove existing walls to create larger rooms. Ward notes that an addition can do more than add rooms; it can transform the small, separate kitchen, dining room, and living room into a single, spacious, open area for cooking, socializing, and watching TV. Vaulted ceilings are popular for additions for the same reason.

Plan for a large staircase. If you're lucky, the home's existing staircase is located close enough to the two-story addition that a new one isn't needed. If a new staircase is needed, however, it's likely to take up more space than the homeowner might want. The trusses between floors should line up precisely, Otherwise, the floors and ceilings of the addition won't even out with those of the original structure.

If the addition leaves the backyard too small for a good-size deck, build the deck on the side of the house instead.





# Removing Wallpaper: The Basics

Whether you're updating the old décor of a house you just purchased or rethinking your choice of bright floral wallpaper for your dining room, removing wallpaper can be a messy and time-consuming project. Learn these basics and you'll be on your way to bare walls in no time.

#### **Before You Start**

- You may be tempted to paint or paper over the current wallpaper, but doing so can result in a bumpy, uneven (and even peeling) wall surface.
- Know what's underneath the wallpaper. Drywall is more likely to gouge than plaster. It's also more susceptible to water damage, so avoid over wetting it.
- Dry-strippable wall coverings, which often have smooth, plastic-like textures, can be removed by hand.
   Non-strippable wall covering is trickier to remove.
- Find out what kind of wallpaper you're dealing with by peeling away a piece with a utility knife, starting
  at a top corner. Grasping the tip of the wallpaper, try to pull it down while keeping it as close to the wall
  as possible.
- If it's strippable, it should peel away from the wall when you apply steady pressure.
- If it doesn't peel off, or if only the decorative surface layer peels off, you'll need to use a different approach (see below).

#### **Techniques**

- If the paper is strippable, slowly peel back each strip at a 10- to 15- degree angle. If you pull the paper straight out, you risk damaging the wall surface.
- If the wallpaper doesn't come off with this method, you have a few options. First, try warm water and a
  wallpaper removal solvent. Saturate the wall with the solvent (a paint roller works especially well) and
  scrape the paper off with a wallpaper scraper.
- If drywall is underneath, make sure to scrape off the paper within 15 minutes to avoid damaging the surface.
- Tough jobs may require you to rent an electrical steamer, which consists of a heated water tank with a
  long hose attached to a perforated steamer plate. Follow the manufacturer's instructions for detailed
  directions.

### Safety Measures

- Protect yourself from chemical vapors by wearing a painter's mask.
- Cover the floor with a canvas drop cloth or towels.






