

I will be stepping down as President of the RHA Board in November, and want to share a few things with you;



Neighborhood real estate continues to hold steady

Despite national news of a housing slow-down, Richland Park and Richland Oaks continue to see steady resale prices. According to a recent article in *The Dallas Morning News*, on average, median home sales prices in North Texas are up only 1 percent this year.

Here are a few of the list prices for homes in our neighborhood. A comparative market analysis notes that the average number of days our homes are on the market ranges from 37 to 43 days with the cost per square foot approximately \$75.

How to report those streetlight outages

According to the Richardson Citizens Information Office our streetlights are maintained by TXU. When one burns out or needs repair, residents should call the City at 972-744-4330 or TXU directly 24 hours a day at 1-888-313-4747.

Residents can also visit http:// www.txuelectricdelivery.com/ and click on "Report Streetlight Outages" on the left side of the page.

When reporting a light outage, you should have the exact location—the address closest to the streetlight, an intersecting street or block number.

After an outage is reported, TXU does the work and normal repair time for streetlights is 10 working days. However, when there is an underground cable problem, the repair usually takes several weeks.

Conserving water still important for the area

Lake levels are now normal but city leaders remind us that water conservation is a yearround practice and are offering water conservation kits for \$8 (indoor) and \$12 (outdoor).



This project is about to begin. We will start planting new evergreen foliage, grasses and other plant material.








